Please click here to view the Community Transmission and Severity Scorecard for the Period of 10/25 – 10/31 from the Shawnee County Health Department (SCHD). The index score has increased seven points from 14 to 21 this week and is now in the "Uncontrolled" index.

Shawnee County is experiencing a sharp increase (70%) in the number of cases diagnosed last week with the percentage of positive tests increasing from 5.4% to 10.7% (the first time it crossed the 10% mark). Both hospitals report an increase in the level of utilization of testing and inpatient services, and the health department is currently unable to follow up timely with every new case diagnosed. As a result of these developments, I wanted to reiterate the mitigation strategies we are using in our schools to reduce the spread.

- 1. Masks
- 2. Handwashing Breaks
- 3. Physical Distancing (Secondary Schools)
- 4. Cohorting (Elementary Schools)
- 5. Temperature Checks
- 6. Contact Tracing
- 7. Cleaning and Disinfecting

I am providing a <u>link of a recent letter from the county health department</u> urging schools to limit our event sizes to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19. In light of the county's increase in positive cases and this recent letter, I have made the decision to limit the Friday, November 6 football game to 500 people. This gathering size will include all participants, so tickets will be limited to essential personnel and family members. The district will be live streaming this game, and all additional home games, so fans have the option of viewing postseason football games from home.
